Why do we ask for you to bring a fecal sample?

Also known as a stool sample, intestinal parasite screen or just plain old poop. Even though you may not be able to see any worms in the fecal sample, neither can we! That's why we spin it down in a centrifuge, use a special solution and look under a microscope for the eggs from the worms. We don't want to wait until your pet is losing weight, not eating or having diarrhea before checking the fecal sample for worms. That's why we recommend you bring in a fresh sample for us to check.

The companion animal parasite council recommends checking the stool sample at least once a year if not twice a year. Roundworms and hookworms are zoonotic meaning people can get them, causing skin lesions or even blindness! If your pet has been around other pets where they can eat their feces, licking/grooming themselves or other animals, or even the dog park we encourage you to bring a fecal sample with you at their annual visit!

Five Toxins You May Not Know About

March is pet poison prevention awareness month and we thought we should share some lesser known toxins.

- Coins- Eating money may end up costing you a lot of money! Pennies can cause zinc toxicity, which can be fatal if not treated. Luckily these can be easily spotted on a radiograph (X-ray). (Many diaper rash creams contain Zinc too, so ask your vet before using medications!)
- Acetaminophen- Commonly found in Tylenol. While safe in humans, it can be extremely toxic to cats. They cannot metabolize the drug and may end up with liver failure!
- Decongestants- These can be found in cold medicine and even anti-histamines! They can cause heart problems in pets. It is very important to ask your vet before giving your pets medications, as our pets are not like small children!
- 4. Xylitol- An artificial sweetener found in many candies and gums. This toxin can cause liver disease, low blood sugar and sometimes even seizures.
- 5. Gorilla Glue- This and other wood glues will become a firm, enlarged foreign body when mixed with stomach acid. The only way to treat this is to surgically remove it as it becomes so expanded in the stomach.
