Hyperthyroidism vs. Hypothyroidism

Hyperthyroidism is a disease most commonly seen in older cats. It is an overactive thyroid gland. The most common sign is weight loss in the face of an increased appetite. In fact, many cats are ravenously hungry and very vocal about it. Other signs can be increased thirst, vomiting or diarrhea. Hyperthyroidism can be diagnosed with a simple blood test. There are several different treatment options ranging from medication, radiation or sometimes surgery.

Hypothyroidism is a disease usually seen in dogs. Signs include dry hair, hair loss, skin disease, lethargy and weight gain (opposite of hyperthyroidism). It is a lifelong disease that is diagnosed with a blood test. The treatment is a daily medication. It does require monitoring bloodwork to ensure that the dog isn't getting too much thyroid supplement and causing the pet to become hyperthyroid.

Dental Disease Facts

- Poor dental health can lead to gingivitis (inflammation of the gums), bad breath, and sometimes even teeth falling out.
- Most pets won't show any sign of pain or difficulty eating with dental disease.
- Bacteria from the tartar can enter your pet's bloodstream and cause infection in the rest of the body, affecting the heart, kidneys and/or liver.
- Prevention is the best way to manage dental disease.
- At Riverview we use a scaler, polisher and apply fluoride treatment for every dental. We also recommend dental radiographs (x-rays) on every pet, as this will tell us about the disease going on under the gum line.
