**Signs of oral and dental diseases in dogs and cats:**

- Bad breath.
- Loose teeth or teeth that are discolored or covered in tartar.
- Your pet shies away from you when you touch the mouth area.
- Drooling or dropping food from the mouth.
- Bleeding from the mouth.
- Loss of appetite or loss of weight (this combination can result from diseases of many organs, and early veterinary examination is important).

**'No Sedation Dentals'**

Anesthesia free teeth cleanings are not able to clean beneath the gum line to prevent periodontal disease, nor allows examination beneath the gum-line to identify problems before they become painful and expensive to treat. Current anesthetic protocols used in properly screened patients (physical exam\* and blood profile^ ) are safe and minimize stress and discomfort.
