Puppy or Kitten Vaccinations

Our puppy and kitten P.A.W. Plans are designed to offer your new pet all the benefits of veterinary services available to him or her for one year. Included in this service for puppies is a series of examinations and vaccinations including rabies, distemper, parvovirus, bordetella, and leptospirosis and for kittens, a series of examinations and vaccinations including rabies, panleukopenia (distemper), leukemia, rhinotracheitis, and calicivirus.

Examination and consultation

A consultation with a veterinarian and a complete medical assessment begins with a thorough physical examination whereby your pet's eyes, ears, skin, cardiovascular, neurological, gastrointestinal and skeletal system are examined for any abnormalities.

Fecal testing for parasites

Intestinal parasites are very common in puppies and kittens. Pets can become infected with parasites before they are born or later through their mother's milk. Often there are no symptoms, especially in the early stages. The microscopic examination of a stool sample will help us to determine the presence of intestinal parasites. We are looking for such things as roundworms, hookworms, whipworms, tapeworms, giardia and coccidia. We recommend this exam for all puppies and kittens for their health and also for yours as they can pass parasites to you and your family.

What you can expect from our services:

Pre surgical blood work

Typical tests are a complete blood count (CBC) to identify hidden infection, anemia, potential bleeding problems, or immune suppression. It also includes chemistry tests to see how well certain organs are functioning. This way we avoid stumbling into situations where inadequate organ function impairs anesthetic elimination or increases the likelihood of complications. Even apparently healthy animals can have serious organ system problems that cannot be detected without blood testing. If serious problems are detected, surgery can be postponed until the problem is corrected. Also depending on past medical history, electrocardiograms (EKG), or x-rays may be required before surgery.

Blood screen for immune suppressing diseases

This blood test screens cats for feline immunodeficiency virus and feline leukemia virus. By testing for these potentially fatal diseases we can ensure our kittens have a better chance at a long and healthy life.

Nail Trimming

Long nails can make walking uncomfortable and can even cause lameness. This is why trimming nails is important on a regular basis. As a rule they should be just off the ground when your pet is standing.

Spaying refers to the surgical procedure performed on female dogs and cats to render them infertile. There are many benefits to spaying your female companion. First, you will contribute to the prevention of the dog and cat overpopulation. Second, spaying will eliminate the sometimes 'messy' heat cycles that attract male dogs to your house from miles away. Third, you will help prevent diseases in your pet such as pyometra (infection in the uterus) and mammary cancer. Spaying involves surgical removal of both ovaries and the uterus.

Neutering refers to the surgical procedure performed on male dogs and cats to render them infertile. There are many benefits to neutering your male companion. First, you will contribute to the prevention of the dog and cat overpopulation. Second, neutering will eliminate undesirable and at times, embarrassing behavior in your male companion. Third, you will help prevent diseases in your pet such as prostate disease and testicular cancer. Neutering involves surgical removal of both testicles.



Both surgical procedures are performed under a general anesthetic. A registered veterinary technician continually assesses your pet's vital signs during the procedure. We monitor such things as heart rate, blood pressure, temperature, respiration, and blood oxygen. Your pet will receive intravenous fluid therapy, pain medications as well as laser therapy to reduce pain and promote healing.
