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## Feline Preventative Healthcare Guidelines

All cats should have a veterinary examination at least annually. For many cats, more frequent visits may be appropriate. Decisions regarding specific frequency of visits should be made based on individual needs of your cat.

## Health Evaluation:

Your cats' Health Evaluation is determined from these categories:

- o Life style and life stage
- o Behavior
- o Diet
- o Dental assessment
- Pain assessment
- Body and muscle condition scoring

After your pet's doctor completes an evaluation of the above categories he/she will make an assessment of the following:

- o Medical Condition
- o Infectious and zoonotic diseases
- o Parasite prevention and control
- o Dental care
- o Genetic, breed and age considerations
- o Behavior
- Nutrition

## **Healthcare Plans:**

Diagnostic Plan: Every cat should have the following:

- o Heartworm testing in accordance with existing guidelines
- o Retrovirus testing in accordance with existing guidelines
- o At least annual internal parasite testing

Customized plan based on assessment:

- o Other diagnostic tests (including dental radiographs)
- o Early disease screening tests
- o Genetic screening tests

Therapeutic Plan: Every ca

Every cat should receive:

 Year-round broad-spectrum parasite control with efficacy against heartworms, intestinal parasites and fleas

Customized plan based on assessment:

- o Tick control as indicated by assessment
- o Therapeutic recommendations
- o Dental recommendations
- o Behavioral recommendations
- o Environmental enrichment recommendations
- Dietary and feeding recommendations

Prevention Plan:

Every cat should have or receive:

- o Immunization with core vaccines in accordance with existing guidelines
  - Rabies virus
  - Feline panleukopenia virus
  - Feline herpesvirus-1
  - Calicivirus
  - For kittens, feline leukemia virus (considered non core but highly recommended)
- Appropriate identification including microchiping
- Reproductive and genetic counseling and spaying or neutering unless specifically intended for breeding purposes

Customized plan based on assessment:

- o Immunization with non-core vaccines in accordance with existing guidelines
- o Other preventative recommendations and counseling regarding zoonotic diseases

Follow-up Plan:

Establish a plan for follow-up based on assessment and future care recommendations Set expectations for next visit

Customized plan based on assessment:

- o Immunization with non-core vaccines in accordance with existing guidelines
- o Other preventative recommendations and counseling regarding zoonotic diseases

Documentation:

Thorough documentation of the patient visit
